Physical or verbal abuse, harassment, the use of foul language or intimidation will not be tolerated. Threatening phone calls are reported immediately to supervisors and to the police.

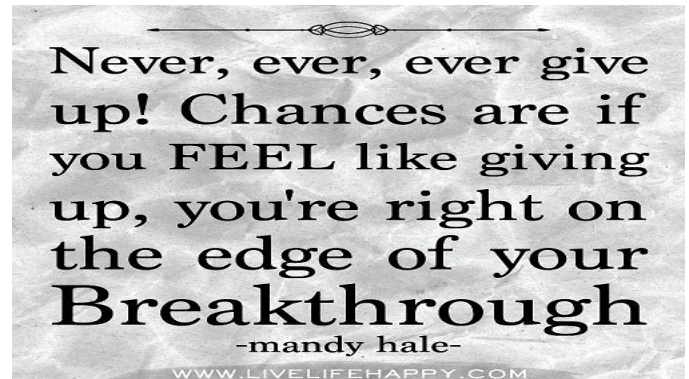
Anyone choosing to exhibit any of the above behaviors maybe refused services and, when warranted, will be asked to leave premises.

This program serves CTSI tribal members looking to avoid foreclosure, facing eviction and those that are homeless, anywhere in the United States of America. There is no waiting list for this program. Funds will be available once funds are received each fiscal year and will be offered based on a first-come, first-served basis. Higher Education and AVT Grants

Higher Ed and Adult Vocational Training (AVT) grants provide funding to attend an accredited college, university, or training program.

Fall 2018 applications for new and continuing Higher Ed and AVT students will be due **JUNE 30, 2018**. Applications for federal financial aid (FAFSA) must be completed by **January 31, 2018**.

But NOW is the time to begin applying to college! Make an appointment today for information about filing out the FAFSA, signing up for the SAT/ACT, help applying to schools, finding additional scholarships, and/or how to apply for tribal assistance.

Note: Applications for clock-hour schools such as truck driving school or beautv school have no deadline and are handled on a case-by-case basis.

Tribal Maternal, Infant, & Early Childhood Home Visiting Program

Naytlh - 'a "We Carry the Children"



Our home visiting program provides parenting and life skills for successful and positive parenting. We serve native families that are either expecting or have infants under the age of twelve months, continuing through the child's third birthday. We travel throughout the 11 county service areas of the Confederated Tribe of Siletz Indians. The model and curriculum we provide is called Family Spirit and was developed by the John Hopkins Center for American Indian Health. We are funded by the Tribal Maternal, Infant, Early Childhood Home Visiting Program (TMIECHV).

Family Spirit is Evidence based and culturally sensitive to native families. Parents gain knowledge and skills for their developing infant through 36 months of age. We also focus on goals and healthy living for parents as a support system for the family as a whole. The program consists of 63 lessons over a 39 month period and is divided into six modules. The modules are broken into these categories: Prenatal care (9 lessons), infant care (16 lessons), your growing child (11 lessons), toddler care (9 lessons), my family and me (6 lessons), and healthy living (12 lessons). While this may seem like a big commitment the lessons vary from 30 minutes to 90 minutes and some can be combined together as we work with your schedule. Family Spirit suggests we deliver at least 32 lessons to our families in order for families to benefit from the evidence based curriculum. For the full benefits of the program we would like to provide all 63 to our families. As a thank you for participating in our program we offer some incentives which we will be happy to share with you upon the enrolled in our program.

During your participation if you feel like the timeline of lessons is too often we can adjust the home visits to accommodate your schedule while still keeping the programs timeline in mind. We are a voluntary program that delivers home visits in the comfort of the homes of our families. If you would like to get more information and or meet our home visiting staff would love to schedule a home visit to give you a full overview of the program.

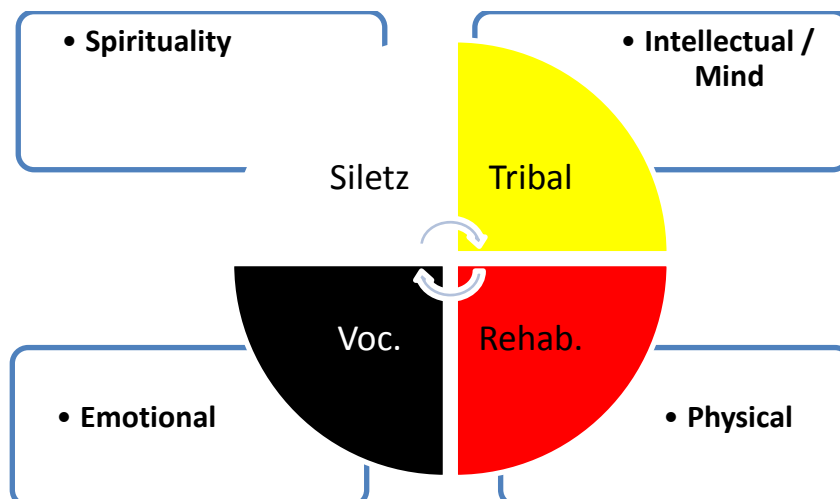

All components are offered on a budgetary basis

Classroom Training (CRT)

CRT services are available for Vocational Training, GED completion, a term of Higher Ed.

Direct Placement

DP is available to any tribal member who has obtained full time employment and applies within seven days of the hire date. Service provides clothing and tools necessary for work.

On-the-Job Training (OJT)

OJT is available to any tribal member seeking employment. It is a reimbursement to an employer for half of a hired employee's wages, up to \$4,500.00 or 6 months, whichever comes first.

Work Experience (WEX)

WEX can be used to obtain current training and skills to be a valued employee. 480 hours paid at minimum wage.

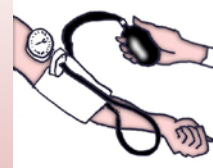

Blood Pressure Screenings



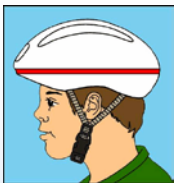

- 2.) Sustain a fall that causes the helmet to hit the ground.

10 Ways You Can Help Stop the Flu and Stay Healthy

1. Wash your hands frequently with soap and water for 20 seconds or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available.
2. Avoid touching your nose, mouth and eyes (The T-zone of your face). This can introduce an infection into your body.
3. Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue or cough into your elbow. Make sure to throw tissues in the trash and wash your hands after sneezing or coughing.
4. Disinfect surfaces with antiseptic cleaners like Lysol, sanitary wipes or a bleach solution. You can easily make your own bleach cleaning solution using 1 teaspoon bleach to 1 quart of water. A little bleach goes a long way and it is also toxic so be careful while handling.
5. Drink plenty of healthy fluids. Water is the liquid of life; it makes up 75% of our bodies. It dilutes and helps flush toxins and other negative substances in our bodies. For those who are too bored of water alone, be smart in choosing fluids that hydrate you and give you beneficial amounts of needed calories and electrolytes.

6. Stay home if you are sick for at least 24 hours after your fever has resolved without the use of medication and you are symptom-free.

7. Get your flu shot!



8. Eat your veggies. Eating a balanced meal of the food groups ensures that you get nutritional value from foods that help you stay healthy. If you are like most people and fall short of the recommended 6 servings of fruits and vegetables per day, take a multi-vitamin.

9. Get your Zzzzzzz. Sleep is good medicine. Everyone needs different amounts of sleep each night. Know your body and what it takes for you to feel well-rested and to have enough energy to tackle the day ahead of you.

10. Be active! Active people are healthier people. Park further away from the store entrance, use the stairs instead of the elevator, go on a walk after dinner and enjoy the nice weather, get outside with the kids, remind yourself why Oregon has the most photographed beaches in the country, go fishing, find a trail, join a gym, get creative and go play (it isn't just for kids!).

Second Distribution: For any eligible hunter, regardless of what other tags they have received.

PERMITS FOR FIREWOOD CUTTING

The Tribe has firewood cutting area(s) near Siletz accessible to Tribal members. Permits to cut and load firewood for home heating are issued by the Tribe's Natural Resources department, 800-922-1399. Tribal members may drop by the office in Siletz to get a permit or call to request that a permit be mailed. A permit allows cutting of up to 2 cords of firewood for personal use. Tribal Elders may give a permission note to another Tribal member to gather firewood on their behalf. The firewood permit would be issued to the Tribal member with the permission note to deliver firewood to that Elder's home. I hope everyone has had a chance to check out the new income guideline and the increased (up \$50 to \$400) standard deduction. Remember, we take your gross income and multiply it by the 20% tax deduction and then do the deductions, like child care, child support and the standard deduction if you pay rent or utilities. If you are over 62, and have out of pocket medical expenses we can also deduct a portion of that. All we need is 1 Tribal ID (any federally recognized tribe) in the household and we can certify the entire household. If you have foster children that are tribal, we can also certify the household, and we count the payments that are received for those children. We also count adoption subsidies if you have adopted tribal children.
