2018 College Students Summer Internship Program New Deadline!

The deadline to apply for the Tribe's 2018 College Students Summer Internship Program has been moved up to March 16, 2018. Selecting students earlier will allow more time to develop relevant work site placements so students can start internships in late June or early July.

To be eligible you must be at least a half-time student attending a two-year or four-year college and in good academic standing.

Applications will be mailed to known students, but if you do not receive an application, please contact Assistant General Manager Bonnie Petersen or the Education Specialists at any tribal Area Office to request an application.

This program assists tribal students with locating internship placements to gain work experience in their field of study. There are ten slots available for 2018. Students may work up to 360 hours at tribal minimum wage and can be placed within or outside of the Tribe. Students selected for the program must complete an orientation, criminal history background check, and drug screening (Note: the Tribe does not recognize Oregon laws allowing the use of medical or recreational marijuana). Placements can begin in June, but must be completed by September 28, 2018.

Tribal Maternal, Infant, & Early Childhood Home Visiting Program

Naytlh - 'a "We Carry the Children"



Our home visiting program provides parenting and life skills for successful and positive parenting. We serve native families that are either expecting or have infants under the age of twelve months, continuing through the child's third birthday. We travel throughout the 11 county service areas of the Confederated Tribe of Siletz Indians. The model and curriculum we provide is called Family Spirit and was developed by the John Hopkins Center for American Indian Health. We are funded by the Tribal Maternal, Infant, Early Childhood Home Visiting Program (TMIECHV).

Family Spirit is Evidence based and culturally sensitive to native families. Parents gain knowledge and skills for their developing infant through 36 months of age. We also focus on goals and healthy living for parents as a support system for the family as a whole. The program consists of 63 lessons over a 39 month period and is divided into six modules. The modules are broken into these categories: Prenatal care (9 lessons), infant care (16 lessons), your growing child (11 lessons), toddler care (9 lessons), my family and me (6 lessons), and healthy living (12 lessons). While this may seem like a big commitment the lessons vary from 30 minutes to 90 minutes and some can be combined together as we work with your schedule. Family Spirit suggests we deliverer at least 32 lessons to our families in order for families to benefit from the evidence based curriculum. For the full benefits of the program we would like to provide all 63 to our families. As a thank you for participating in our program we offer some incentives which we will be happy to share with you upon the enrolled in our program.

During your participation if you feel like the timeline of lessons is too often we can adjust the home visits to accommodate your schedule while still keeping the programs timeline in mind. We are a voluntary program that delivers home visits in the comfort of the homes of our families. If you would like to get more information and or meet our home visiting staff would love to schedule a home visit to give you a full overview of the program.



Classroom Training (CRT)

CRT services are available for Vocational Training, GED completion, a term of Higher Ed.

Direct Placement

DP is available to any tribal member who has obtained full time employment and applies within seven days of the hire date. Service provides clothing and tools necessary for work.

On-the-Job Training (OJT)

OJT is available to any tribal member seeking employment. It is a reimbursement to an employer for half of a hired employee's wages, up to \$4,500.00 or 6 months, whichever comes first.

Work Experience (WEX)

WEX can be used to obtain current training and skills to be a valued employee. 480 hours paid at minimum wage.

When accidents happen with chemicals or medicine, call Poison Help (1-800-222-1222).

Get help right away from a nurse, pharmacist, or other poison expert. If someone has trouble breathing, call 911 or your local emergency ambulance number right away.

SEASONAL TIPS SPRING

As you begin spring cleaning and work on the yard, follow these simple tips to keep

Household Cleaners and Other Chemical Products

- Keep poisons in the containers they came in.
 Do not use food containers (such as cups or bottles) to store household cleaners and other strong chemicals.
- Store strong chemicals away from food. Many poisonings occur when one product is mistaken for another.
- Read and follow the directions for use of products.
 Do this BEFORE using the products. Follow the advice carefully.
- Never mix chemicals. Doing so can create a poisonous gas.
- Turn on fans and open windows when using strong chemicals.
- When spraying chemicals, direct spray nozzle away from people and pets.
- · Never sniff containers to see what's inside.
- Discard old or outdated products. First aid advice on containers may be incorrect and outdated.
- Call Poison Help (1-800-222-1222) to double check first aid information.
- Even in small amounts, windshield wiper fluid is poisonous. If swallowed, it can cause blindness or death to people and pets.
- Strong chemicals can burn the skin. Drain openers, toilet cleaners, rust removers, and oven cleaners can cause such burns.
- Hydrocarbon liquids (liquids made from petroleum) are poisonous. They include gasoline, kerosene, charcoal lighter fluid, paint thinner, baby oil, lamp oil, and furniture polish.

 If hydrocarbons are swallowed, they can easily get into the lungs. Even a small amount can cause breathing problems. The liquid coats the inside of the lungs. That prevents oxygen from entering the blood stream.

Mushrooms

- Only experts can tell poisonous mushrooms from safe mushrooms.
- Poisonous mushrooms, called "death caps," often grow in yards and parks.
- Eating even a few bites of certain mushrooms can cause liver damage that can kill you.

Pesticides

- Pesticides (pest killers) can be taken in through the skin or inhaled. Even leather shoes and gloves do not offer full protection. Pesticides can be extremely poisonous. Stay away from areas that have been sprayed until the spray has dried or for at least one hour.
- Wear protective clothing when using bug spray or other spray products. Put on a long-sleeve shirt, long pants, socks, shoes, and gloves. Remove and wash clothing after using chemicals.
- If pesticides are splashed onto the skin, rinse with running water for 15–20 minutes. If pesticide contacts clothing, take off the clothing before rinsing skin.
- Many garden chemicals are poisonous to children and adults. These chemicals can be harmful if swallowed or inhaled.



Elk Tag Opportunity

The Tribal Natural Resources Department will once again be offering a limited number of Landowner Preference (LOP) elk tags to Tribal members for this fall's hunting season. As a landowner, the Tribe is eligible to participate in the State's LOP program. Based on the number of acres that the Tribe owns, we can get 6 additional antlerless elk tags from the State. These LOP tags are not related to the Tribe's Consent Decree tags that we receive each year. They are based solely on the Tribe being a landowner.

There are a number of important differences between the LOP tags and the Tribe's regular tags. These are summarized in the table below.

Please note that a major difference between the LOP tags and the Tribe's regular tags is that **ONLY** the person drawn for the tag can hunt that tag. **The tag cannot be given to someone else to hunt for you.** Therefore, only those folks serious about hunting this hunt themselves are eligible to apply.

The drawing for the 6 LOP elk tags will be held at the Natural Resources Committee Meeting to be held on April 2nd at 4:45 PM in the Natural Resources Department Map Room. Applications are available on the Tribal website and at the Tribal Natural Resources Office in Siletz. Completed applications are due in the Natural Resources office by **4:30 PM March 30**, **2018**. For more information regarding these tags and the differences between the Tribe's regular tags and the LOP tags, contact Natural Resources Manager Mike Kennedy at 541-444-8232.

JALAPENO POPPER CORN SALAD

INGREDIENTS:

- 5 CAN S CORN KERNELS (OR 8 COOKED EARS OF CORN), RINSED & DRAINED*
- 1 CUP BACON, COOKED AND CRUMBLED
- 1 CUP CHEDDAR CHEESE, GRATED *
- ½ CUP CREAM CHEESE, ROOM TEMPERATURE
- ¼ CUP SOUR CREAM
- 2 JALAPENOS, SEEDS AND RIBS REMOVED, MINCED
- 2 TABLESPOONS OLIVE OIL
- 1/4 TEASPOON CHILI POWDER
- SALT & PEPPER TO TASTE

PREPARATION:

- 1. Heat olive oil in a large skillet over medium high heat and sauté corn kernels until lightly browned.
- 2. In a large bowl, combine corn, bacon and jalapenos, and then stir in cheese, cream cheese and sour cream.
- 3. Season with chili powder and salt and pepper. Taste and adjust seasoning if necessary.
- 4. Serve immediately or refrigerate until chilled.
