Spotlight Spotlight

Each month we will spotlight a particular style of powwow dance.



Feather Dance (Naa Dosh)

The Feather Dance or Nee-dash (the dance) as it is called in Athabaskan, is the principle traditional Dance ceremony of Siletz Indians. It originated from Southwest Oregon Athabaskan people (Just south of Coos Bay to Crescent City Ca. and inland to the villages almost to present day I-5.) In ancient times and up to the 1850's and our peoples removal from their original lands the Nee-dash was held every winter around the solstice (The shortest day of the year.) When the people were in their original places the dance was held for 10 days in the larger villages. Once the Siletz Reservation was established many other Siletz tribes began to participate in the Dance and still do to this day. The whole reason for the Dance is to thank the creator for making the world and us. Songs are sung during the Dance and dancers come out in a side to side motion, women upright and men crouching low to the floor planks of the Dance House. The Dance line is a crescent shape facing the fire in the center of the house. Prayers are also said in between each song and dance that recount the SW coast creation story of how the world was put together for us to live on. The Dance is now 3 days. Dancers dress plainly on the first night and gradually end up with the finest regalia by the end dance on the last night. Really it is all about giving thanks through song, dance and prayer.



Plan Early for School Immunizations and Physicals to Ensure Your Child's Health and Beat the Back-to-School Rush

Many parents aren't seriously thinking about back-to-school preparations in July and August. And while some activities – shopping for supplies, going to try-outs and orientation, arranging carpools – can wait until August, you might find yourself in a bind if you put off necessary vaccinations and physicals. You're probably aware that Local laws requires a certain number of doses of mandated vaccines before the first day of school. What you might not know is that you could face long wait times and even shortages of certain vaccines if you wait until the last few weeks before school.

The following vaccines usually are required (except with valid exemptions) for elementary, middle and high school students: diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, polio, chickenpox, hepatitis A and B, measles, mumps and rubella. While immunizations may not be required for all, immunizing your children is a way to help prevent the spread of communicable diseases at school and protect the well-being of your family at home.

In addition to immunizations, students participating in athletics or other extra-curricular activities may be required to undergo a physical examination before school starts. For some sports and extra-curricular organizations — especially football, cheerleading and band — practice begins weeks before the first day of school and will require physicals even earlier. A proper school physical should include both a medical history and a physical examination to ensure early detection of any health-related issues. For school-aged children, the American Academy of Pediatrics recommends an annual physical for those entering kindergarten (five and six years of age), then every other year and resuming an annual exam during middle school and teen years.

So don't get too lethargic during the days of summer. Avoid the rush and get your children's back-to-school vaccinations and physicals early. You can spend the rest of the season enjoying yourself with the knowledge that your kids are healthy and prepared for the school year.

Incentive Awards for Siletz Tribal Graduates

The Tribe has an incentives program for Tribal members reaching milestones in their education from Head Start (Can only receive incentive for 1 year), elementary school, middle school, high school, Adult Vocational Training program and bachelor degree, master degree and doctoral degree. If you have reached one of these milestones, please send in a copy of your certificates or diploma to Sonya at the Salem area office with your contact information, which includes address and phone number.

Beach Trip

We will be going to the beach on August 23, 2018. We will be leaving at 9:00am. We will have limited transportation available on the vans and youth must be 9 years old to ride on the van without a chaperone. Please call Sonya by August 10, 2018 to sign up.

Culture in the Park/Swimming

We will have a picnic, cultural activities and go swimming in the afternoon at Sellwood Park on August 15, 2018. This will be a joint activity between the Portland and Salem Area Offices. Please call and sign up by August 3, 2018. Transportation is limited.

State Fair

We will have tickets for families to attend the Oregon State Fair. These tickets are for JOM eligible families only. You must pre-register for the tickets. They are general admission tickets. The deadline to sign up for tickets will be August 9, 2018, no additional tickets will be purchased after the deadline. Each parent will need to call to sign up his or her own children. You cannot call and sign up for tickets for other people, only your children.

School Supplies

We will be distributing school supplies to JOM students. When calling in let us know the name of your students and what grades they will be going into. The deadline to call in for school supplies will be August 9, 2018. After that date orders will be filled by the supplies we have remaining. Please leave a phone number where you can be reached, so that we can call and let you know when you may pick up your supplies. We will be distributing the supplies August 20-22, 2018

HIGHER EDUCATION/ADULT VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM

The deadline to apply for 2018/2019 year was June 30, 2018. The next deadline to apply is June 31, 2019. It is a requirement that you complete your FAFSA by January 31, 2019 to be eligible to receive tribal assistance.

ADULT EDUCATION

The Adult Education program is for Siletz Tribal members, 16 years or older, who are not already enrolled in a formal education program. The Adult Education program can assist with the following: Obtaining GED, certificates, or otherwise raise levels of educational achievement through adult classes to improve employment status through education/training. There is no deadline to apply for classes. For an application, please call SONYA at (503) 390-9494.

Siletz Tribal Youth Activity Fund

Helps to fund programs for Siletz tribal youth in the many areas such as: sports, music, camp fees, lab fees, shop supplies, graduation, educational /scholastic materials, cultural supplies and materials, correspondence courses, and extra-curricular supplies. Siletz Tribal members from kindergarten to high school can access up to \$75.00.

Siletz Tribal Head Start (Salem)

If you want to have your 3 or 4 year old attend Head Start you must get your applications in as soon as possible. It is first come first served. Applications are available on the Tribe's website and in all Area Offices.

The model and curriculum we use is Family Spirit developed by the John Hopkins Center for American Indian Health. Family Spirit is evidence based and culturally sensitive to native families. The Peer Recovery Mentor assists A/D and Mental Health clients getting service through the Siletz Tribe. Assistance includes, but is not limited to: Meeting individuals where they are at to discover opportunities which may change their lives; working with individuals to identify any barriers to recovery they may have and develop a working plan to overcome these barriers; outreach services obtaining A&D assessment and referrals for medically assisted substance treatment, residential substance treatment, outpatient substance treatment services; act as liaison to other CTSI programs – SSP, Vocational-Rehab, Education, medical and cultural programs; walk with individuals through Legal and DHS providing moral support; assist in locating recovery based housing; attending self-help meetings with individuals and groups; assist in getting a sponsor; and integrating individuals into a positive peer recovery community.

I am available to meet with individuals who are incarcerated and will soon be released.

Summer activities continue:

It's gotten hot, and people are looking for places to cool down. More people can be found around sources of water, and if you haven't reserved space at the coast, you may not get in that camping trip (happened to me last weekend!). With the heat comes an increase in irritability as our bodies naturally dehydrate. To help combat that irritability, remember to drink more water than you want to, take breaks, and seek out shade to rest in.



Many activities are being held by various programs in the Siletz tribe. One activity I got the honor of participating in recently was the 9 Tribes Suicide Prevention camp hosted by the Klamath tribe, June 19th—23rd. 11 youth from the Siletz tribe joined many youth from most of the other 9 tribes at Mountain Lakes Bible Camp and the surrounding areas, such as Crater Lake. Activities included learning how to make moccasins and hand drums, zip lining or a boat ride, and an adventure to Crater Lake where some youth jumped into the freezing cold water!


