Siletz Tribal Code § 9.200

§ 9.200 PURPOSE AND AUTHORITY

The purpose of this ordinance is to establish the criteria by which members of other federally-recognized Indian tribes shall be declared to have Aclose social and economic ties@ with the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians of Oregon for purposes of eligibility for Indian Health Contract Services (with approval and certification to be made by the Indian Health Service). The authority or adoption of this ordinance is Article IV, Section 1 of the Siletz Constitution, adopted June 2, 1979, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on June 13, 1979.

CLOSE SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC TIES ORDINANCE Siletz Tribal Code § 9.200

The Tribal Council shall decide requests for close social and economic ties upon request by a person, made in writing and shall state supporting reasons. For purposes of CHS funding, no person who is not a tribal member shall be determined to have close social and economic ties with the Siletz Tribe. § 9.203 <u>APPEALS</u>

Parties whose requests are denied may appeal to the Tribal Court under the Tribal Court Rules and Procedures Ordinance.
