Temporary Tribal Student Assistance Program "TTSAP"

The Siletz Tribal Housing Department's Temporary Tribal Student Assistance Program (TTSAP) will be accepting applications for the 2019-2020 academic year beginning May 1, 2019.

Program Information:

- ♦ The TTSAP assists Tribal students who will be attending a college, university, vocational or trade school.
- ♦ The TTSAP is a time-limited program. Funding is for one academic year.
- ♦ The TTSAP assists students with rent or room and board in a dormitory.

The student's share of the rent is 30 percent of their adjusted annual income. Important Note: The student might be required to remit a portion of the rent. For example, if a student is working the wages will affect the student's share of the rent. Assistance is not transferable.

STHD will accept applications from May 1, 2019, through May 31, 2019. If applications are received after May 31, 2019, they will not be accepted by the Siletz Tribal Housing Department.

Neachesna Village Afterschool Reading Program

Neachesna Village Super Readers is a program for Tribal youth in grades 1-5 in Lincoln City who are below grade level in reading. Our focus is to help students who have fallen behind in reading reach grade level.

The program runs Monday-Friday, 4-6 p.m. If there is a weekday off from school, we generally stay open from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. The program provides a snack daily for participating students. Kids can ride the school bus from North Lincoln schools, but parents must pick up their children from the site by 6 p.m.

Super Readers focuses on a three-step approach: Silent Reading, Read Aloud by an adult reader and One-on-One reading interventions with our site tutor. Students receive an individualized reading plan
