HEBO, Ore. – The Drift Creek Falls Trail and trailhead will close temporarily while repairs are made to a section of washed-out trail.

The trail is expected to reopen around Oct. 7, but visitors are encouraged to contact the Hebo Ranger Station to confirm.

The approximately 100-foot section of washed-out trail has been depositing soil into Drift Creek, which may impact fish habitat, and has interfered with hikers' ability to enjoy this popular trail. The repairs will include constructing a rock gabion, or small retaining wall, and re-establishing the walking surface.
