EMERGENCY HOUSING ASSISTANCE FUNDING

OPEN FOR 2022

Entire application must be complete before assistance can be provided. Assistance cannot exceed \$1.500.00 and participants may only access this program once every 3 (three) years. This program serves CTSI tribal members looking avoid foreclosure, facing eviction and those that are homeless, anywhere in the United States of America. There is no waiting list for this program. Funds will be available once funds are received each fiscal year and will be offered based on a first-come, first-served basis. When funding has been exhausted, applications will no longer be accepted. Applications are available through Siletz Tribal Housing Department, the CTSI website and all area offices

- *JOM Fall Activities Send Out* Do you want to receive fun and educational activities for the rest of 2021? This program will be running in October, November and December. - Online Tutoring We realize that schooling has experienced some difficulties regarding consistency. We are currently offering on demand as well as scheduled academic support available 24/7. Tribal Health Scholars Program

Healthcare focused internship for High School Juniors and Seniors!

Applications due Wednesday, December 1st, 2021.

Tribal Health Scholars (THS) is a paid externship program where AIAN high school students are supported and inspired to envision themselves as healthcare professionals and to pursue education required for a career in a healthcare field.

Due to COVID-19 in-person shadowing has been suspended so the THS program has pivoted to a completely virtual experience. Scholars meet as a group with our NNACoE team each week to discuss the different healthcare careers and pathways.

The program runs for 13 weeks with a one hour meeting each week as a cohort and then two individual meetings at the beginning and end of the pathway. Below is an overview of the program curriculum.

- · Identifying diverse healthcare careers and career paths
- Sharing what healthcare looks like in your community
- Understanding how to apply to schools, scholarships, find additional internships and shadowing opportunities, etc.

Eligibility:

- You must be a high school junior or senior to participate.
- Attendance is important and required every week for the full length of the program.
- Join weekly by computer/Wi-Fi.

477-Self Sufficiency Program – Essential Services during COVID

The 477-Self Sufficiency Program (SSP) is open and providing essential services to eligible families and individuals residing in the CTSI 11-County Service Area. Due to Covid-19, all tribal offices are closed to the public. We are still accepting applications and conducting appointments over the phone, through email or video conference. The SSP has prioritized the following services:

- <u>Pre-Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (Pre-TANF) / Non-Recurrent Short Term Benefits:</u>
 Siletz families below 185% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) may be eligible for short-term financial assistance that doesn't exceed 4 months. The financial assistance is meant to provide basic needs and address short-term emergent needs;
- Regular Temporary Assistance for Needy Families: Siletz families below the countable income limits and FPL may be eligible for monthly grant assistance to meet basic needs;
- <u>General Assistance for Single Adults:</u> Siletz single adults below the countable income limits and FPL may be eligible for monthly grant assistance to meet basic needs;
- <u>Emergency Assistance:</u> Siletz families or single adults may be eligible for support services to prevent eviction or utility shut off. Income guidelines apply;
- <u>Classroom Training:</u> the Program is still providing financial assistance (tuition, stipends and support services) to eligible Native Americans attending GED, Higher Education or Vocational/Occupational Training.
- <u>Childcare Assistance:</u> The Program offers childcare assistance to eligible TANF families while they engage in work or self-sufficiency activities;
- <u>Foster Care Support Services:</u> Childcare assistance to employed foster parents. The Program covers "working hours only" and limited respite.
- Home Visiting: The Program is accepting new families into the Early Childhood Home Visiting
 Program and working with current families to provide lessons in-person. Staff and families will be
 required to adhere to social distancing and wearing masks.
- <u>Direct Placement:</u> Support services (work clothing, transportation, tools, etc.) for Native Americans that recently gained employment. Must apply within 7-days of hire.

Other services such as Work Experience and On-the-Job Training may be available on a limited basis.

If you recently lost your employment due to Covid-19 and need assistance to meet your basic needs, please contact your local CTSI Tribal Office for an application. Additional eligibility criteria apply. SSP staff will reach out to you by phone or email. You can also email 477SSP@ctsi.nsn.us for more information. Please include your name, phone number and the city/county you reside in.



Siletz Tribal Yocational Rehabilitation Program (STYRP)

STVRP is here to assist members of <u>ANY</u> federally recognized Tribe to overcome barriers to employment. We work with individuals who have disabilities and are living within the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians 11 county service area.








VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION: NOVEMBER AWARENESS: PANCREATIC CANCER

Pancreatic Cancer is the 3rd leading cause of cancer in the US. It is diagnosed when there is an abnormal growth of cancer cells (mutated & expansive) on the Pancreas, an organ located behind the lower part of the stomach. Individuals may experience abdominal pain, jaundice, itchy skin, fatigue, and weight loss. Pancreatic Cancer is medically treatable and requires lab tests and imaging. Sometimes surgery gives physicians a better idea of the cancer's stage and treatment options. This cancer may last several months or years depending on the stage of the cancer and treatment (Stages -Pancreatic Cancer Action Network (pancan.org). The exact cause of Pancreatic Cancer is unknown. Risk factors are diabetes,





pancreatitis, and stomach ulcers. The location of the tumor, age, and general health may determine the need for surgery, chemotherapy, and/or radiation.

Symptoms: Early stage of pancreatic cancer may be asymptomatic. Once the disease progresses it may include the following:

- Digestive problems, including abnormal stools, nausea or vomiting
- Pain in the upper abdomen and back
- Loss of appetite
- Sudden weight Loss
- Jaundice (yellowing of the skin and whites of the eyes)
- Very high sugar levels in diabetic patients

Pancreatic cancer rates are increasing due to a lack of information about the need to get screened earlier and promotion by health care systems. Lack of access to health care for Al/AN people is a large factor in increased mortality rates and diagnosis at later stages of this cancer which lowers the rates of survival.

Pancreatic Cancer may cause challenges in the individual's ability to get or keep employment due to functional limitations, i.e., Work Tolerance: lower levels of stamina, strength, lifting ability, walking endurance, intolerance to temperature changes and side effects of chemotherapy. Some accommodations are a flexible work schedule and rest breaks, or working remotely, cushioned floor mats & chairs, heated gloves, ergonomic equipment, and/ or a modified work station.


Tribal Non-Emergency Medical Transportation




Health Benefits of Quitting Smoking

- 20 Minutes after quitting—Your heart rate drops. (CDC)
- 12 hours after quitting— Carbon monoxide levels in your blood drops to normal. (CDC)
- A few months after quitting— Your sense of smell and taste may improve. (National Cancer Institute)
- 2 weeks to 3 months after quitting—Your heart attack risk begins to drop. Your lung function begins to improve. (CDC)
- 1 to 9 months after quitting—

Your coughing and shortness of breath decreases. (CDC)

- 1 year after quitting—Your added risk of coronary heart disease is half that of a smoker.
 (CDC)
- **5 years after quitting**—Your stroke risk is reduced to that of a nonsmoker, 5-15 years after quitting. (CDC)
- 10 years after quitting—Your lung cancer death rate is about half that of a smokers. Your
 risk of cancers of the mouth, throat, esophagus, bladder, kidney, and pancreas decreases.

- 15 years after quitting—Your risk of coronary heart disease is back to that of a nonsmoker. (CDC)




