


Request Your Siletz Tribal ID Card Today!

If you are <u>unable</u> to make it to the Administration building in Siletz to obtain or replace your Siletz Tribal ID card you are now able to request one at on of the three Area Offices; Eugene, Salem and Portland. They will take your photo and obtain your signature then send it to the Enrollment Department in Siletz. Your Tribal ID will then be mailed by CERTIFIED mail to your address on file or to the Area Office where you made your request.

If you have family that <u>do not</u> live in the 11-county service area or are not able to make it to a Tribal office during work hours, there is a form on the Tribal website under Government Listings > Enrollment and the tab marked "Enrollment Forms." Tribal members can print the form titled "Siletz Tribal Identification (ID) Request" and follow the directions regarding the digital photo specifications, identity verification and signature verification then mail the form to the Enrollment Department.

If you have not updated or replaced your Tribal ID card since April 1, 2016 there is a new format and more information on the card that makes it more acceptable as a form of identification with many more places. The expiration date is 10 years from the issue date. When you update your address, send in your Tribal ID card and we will mail you an updated card with your new address.



If you need to replace your card with no changes (for example address or name) within the same calendar year it was issued, there is a \$5.00 replacement fee (per Tribal Resolution #2016-087). You can obtain up to one new Tribal ID card per calendar year at no charge. Call the Enrollment Department at (800) 922-1399 ext. 1258 if you have questions about this fee.

Applications will be mailed to known students, but if you do not receive an application, please contact Assistant General Manager Bonnie Petersen or the Education Specialists at any tribal Area Office to request an application.

This program assists tribal students with locating internship placements to gain work experience in their field of study. There are ten slots available for 2017. Students may work up to 360 hours at minimum wage and can be placed within or outside of the Tribe. Students selected for the program must complete an orientation, criminal history background check, and drug screening (Note: the Tribe does not recognize Oregon laws allowing the use of medical or recreational marijuana). Placements can begin in June, but must be completed by September 30, 2017.

Our home visiting program provides parenting and life skills for successful and positive parenting. We serve native families that are either expecting or have infants under the age of twelve months, continuing through the child's third birthday. We travel throughout the 11 county service areas of the Confederated Tribe of Siletz Indians. The model and curriculum we provide is called Family Spirit and was developed by the John Hopkins Center for American Indian Health. We are funded by the Tribal Maternal, Infant, Early Childhood Home Visiting Program (TMIECHV).

Family Spirit is Evidence based and culturally sensitive to native families. Parents gain knowledge and skills for their developing infant through 36 months of age. We also focus on goals and healthy living for parents as a support system for the family as a whole. The program consists of 63 lessons over a 39 month period and is divided into six modules. The modules are broken into these categories: Prenatal care (9 lessons), infant care (16 lessons), your growing child (11 lessons), toddler care (9 lessons), my family and me (6 lessons), and healthy living (12 lessons). While this may seem like a big commitment the lessons vary from 30 minutes to 90 minutes and some can be combined together as we work with your schedule. Family Spirit suggests we deliverer at least 32 lessons to our families in order for families to benefit from the evidence based curriculum. For the full benefits of the program we would like to provide all 63 to our families. As a thank you for participating in our program we offer some incentives which we will be happy to share with you upon the enrolled in our program.

During your participation if you feel like the timeline of lessons is too often we can adjust the home visits to accommodate your schedule while still keeping the programs timeline in mind. We are a voluntary program that delivers home visits in the comfort of the homes of our families. If you would like to get more information and or meet our home visiting staff would love to schedule a home visit to give you a full overview of the program.

CRT services are available for Vocational Training, GED completion, a term of Higher Ed.

Direct Placement

DP is available to any tribal member who has obtained full time employment and applies within seven days of the hire date. Service provides clothing and tools necessary for work.

On-the-Job Training (OJT)

OJT is available to any tribal member seeking employment. It is a reimbursement to an employer for half of a hired employee's wages, up to \$4,500.00 or 6 months, whichever comes first.

Work Experience (WEX)

WEX can be used to obtain current training and skills to be a valued employee. 480 hours paid at minimum wage.

Siletz Tribal Vocational Rehabilitation Program

The Siletz Tribal Vocational Rehabilitation program (STVRP) is here to assist members of any federally recognized Tribe (living within the Siletz Tribes service area) with overcoming impediments to employment. We work with a diverse population of individuals who have disabilities ranging from cognitive impairments to physical limitations.


If you have a documented disability that creates limitations or prevents you from doing the work you desire or are qualified for, we would like to assist you. We can assist with obtaining and maintaining employment and developing skills. We focus on motivation, identifying your abilities, skills that lead to successful employment and the development of self advocacy.

You should have a strong desire to work and be willing to work collaboratively with STVRP staff to provide you with the services needed to overcome your disability. Your personal goal should be self sufficiency and to live a healthy sustainable lifestyle.

The STVRP also assists transitioning students with disabilities. The ideal age for a student to start working with VR is two to three years before graduation and until the age 22, or graduated from high school. Our program can provide vocational guidance and counseling; assist with identification of employment goals; employment retention; and advocacy within the academic environment. Students with a documented disability or who are on an "Individualized Education Plan - IEP" or on a "504 Plan" are encouraged to participate in the STVRP.

Want help getting a job? Do you have a diagnosed disability (IEP or 504)?

You could be eligible for STVRP services.

Steps in working with Siletz Tribal Vocational Rehabilitation Program: (STVRP)

Step 1: Establish contact with the STVRP Counselor assigned to your school and schedule a meeting. Your first meeting with a STVRP Counselor will be to gather information about you, your needs, and to discuss whether the STVRP fits for you.

If the program is for you......

Step 2: Sign an application and a STVRP Counselor will determine whether or not you're eligible for services by talking with you about your needs, your disability, and what barriers you have as a result. They may also need to do some additional testing and will read through your school records.

Step 3: Once you're eligible, you'll meet with your STVRP Counselor to discuss your goals and plans for employment. STVRP Counselors can provide guidance and counseling to students who need help determining their goals or plan for what they want after high school.

Step 4: You'll also work with your STVRP Counselor to discuss the impact of your barriers as you work to reach your employment goals and determine what services are necessary to help you reach your goals.

April is National Distracted Driving Awareness Month

Pay attention, save a life: Ditch the distractions

More than 80 percent of people say they feel uncomfortable riding with a distracted driver. ODOT and partner agencies, Oregon State Police and AAA Oregon are emphasizing the importance of focusing on driving when you're behind the wheel.

Ditch the distractions:

- 1. **Turn off your cell phone and stow it.** Turn your phone off or switch to silent mode before you get in the car. Then stow it away where it's out of reach.
- 2. **Spread the word.** Record a message on your phone that tells callers you're driving and will get back to them when you're off the road.
- 3. **Install an app.** Apps can help you avoid texting while driving. Go to your app store and search for "distracted driving."
- 4. Pull over. If you need to make a call, pull over to a safe area first.
- 5. **Use your passengers.** Ask a passenger to make the call or respond to a text for you.
- 6. **X the text.** Don't ever text and drive, browse online or read your email while driving. It's dangerous and against the law in most states. Even voice-to-text isn't risk free.
- 7. **Know the law.** Familiarize yourself with the state and local laws before you get in the car. Oregon prohibits the use of hand-held cell phones in addition to texting.
- 8. **Prepare.** If using a GPS device, enter your destination before you start to drive. If you prefer a map or written directions, review them in advance. If you need help while driving, ask a passenger to assist you or pull over to a safe location to review your map.
- 9. Secure your pets. Unsecured pets can be a big distraction in the car.
- 10. Mind the kids. Pull over to a safe place to address situations involving children.
- 11. **Focus on driving.** Multi-tasking behind the wheel is dangerous. Refrain from eating, drinking, reading, grooming, smoking, and any other activity that takes your mind and eyes off the road.

- > Talk to your teens.
- > Set clear "House Rules."

I threw this recipe together at the Siletz warehouse in March. It is so fast and easy, I hope you can try it out with your family.

CHICKEN CORN CHOWDER

2 ONIONS, DICED* 1 HEAD CELERY, DICED* 3 CANS KERNAL CORN, DRAINED* 1/2 CUP FLOUR*

1 STICK BUTTER* 2 CANS SLICED POTATOES, DRAINED* 1 CAN SKIM EVAPORATED MILK* SALT & PEPPER TO TASTE 1 BOX 1% MILK*



- 2 CANS CHICKEN MEAT*
 - 1. Place butter, bacon, onion & celery in a large pot on medium heat. Cook until onion is soft and bacon is getting brown. Add a little kosher salt and pepper to this to draw the moisture out of the veggies.
 - 2. Add the flour to make rue. Cook for about 5 minutes to cook the flour, stir occasionally.

1 LB BACON, SLICED

- 3. Add the corn, potatoes and chicken along with the evaporated milk and the 1% milk.
- 4. Add more salt and pepper and taste.
- 5. Let this simmer for about ½ hour to heat through.

This makes a pretty big pot of soup. Cut it in half or to suit your needs. Very quick and easy soup that is so delicious.

Elk Tag Opportunity

The Tribal Natural Resources Department will once again be offering a limited number of Landowner Preference (LOP) elk tags to Tribal members for this fall's hunting season. As a landowner, the Tribe is eligible to participate in the State's LOP program. Based on the number of acres that the Tribe owns, we can get 6 additional antlerless elk tags from the State. These LOP tags are not related to the Tribe's Consent Decree tags that we receive each year. They are based solely on the Tribe being a landowner.

There are a number of important differences between the LOP tags and the Tribe's regular tags. These are summarized in the table below.

* Note: If you are drawn for an LOP Tag you are still eligible to apply for and be drawn for a Tribal tag.				

Please note that a major difference between the LOP tags and the Tribe's regular tags is that **ONLY** the person drawn for the tag can hunt that tag. **The tag cannot be given to someone else to hunt for you.** Therefore, only those folks serious about hunting this hunt themselves are eligible to apply.

The drawing for the 6 LOP elk tags will be held at the Natural Resources Committee Meeting to be held on April 3rd at 4:45 PM in the Natural Resources Department Map Room. Applications are available on the Tribal website and at the Tribal Natural Resources Office in Siletz. Completed applications are due in the Natural Resources office by 4:30 PM March 31, 2017.
