- Household income must fall within the program income guidelines or employment service guidelines

- Schedule intake appointment.
- Program eligibility determination.

## Grant Assistance

- TANF Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
- **Diverted Services** maintains current employment.
- Pre-TANF Non-recurrent short term benefits (not to exceed 4 months) to meet basic needs for families
- TANF Work Experience Paid training to gain real world work experience, employment references.
- Non-Needy Caretaker Relative Cash grant to caretaker relative of TANF eligible children.
- Housing Stabilization for Victims of Domestic Violence one parent, caretaker relative or child

## Employment & Training

- Classroom Training Assistance with GED, higher education, vocational training or certification.
- Work Experience Paid training to gain real world work experience/employment references.
- On-the-Job Training Employer incentive based program.
- Direct Placement If hired by an employer and need supportive services to become job ready.
- Core Services Provides employment enhancement services to clients.
- Supplemental Youth Services
  Summer employment or educational services to youth 14-24.

## **For Siletz Tribal Members Only**

- **Emergency Assistance** Intended to be a One-Time service to address emergent situations or basic needs.
- **General Assistance for Single Adults (GASA)** Cash payment for eligible single adults to assist with basic needs.
