§ 9.200 PURPOSE AND AUTHORITY

The purpose of this ordinance is to establish the criteria by which members of other federally-recognized Indian tribes shall be declared to have close social and economic ties with the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians for purposes of eligibility for Indian Health Service Purchase/Referred Care (PRC) (with approval and certification to be made by the Indian Health Service). The authority or adoption of this ordinance is Article IV, Section 1 of the Siletz Constitution, adopted June 2, 1979, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on June 13, 1979.

§ 9.202 PERSONS OTHER THAN TRIBAL EMPLOYEES

The Tribal Council shall decide requests for close social and economic ties upon request by a person, made in writing and shall state supporting reasons. For purposes of PRC funding,

no person who is not a member of a federally-recognized tribe, or a minor dependent of a member of a federally-recognized tribe, shall be determined to have close social and economic ties with the Siletz Tribe. § 9.203 **APPEALS**

Parties whose requests are denied may appeal to the Tribal Court under the Tribal Court Rules and Procedures Ordinance.
