Dear Chairman Pigsley:

Congratulations, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Region 10, Mitigation Division has determined the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan 2025 meets the requirements of Title 44 in accordance with Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 44 § 201.7 as a tribal hazard mitigation plan and is approved for the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians.

The plan approval ensures the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians eligibility for project grants under FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Assistance programs including the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP). This plan also ensures eligibility for post-disaster assistance including Public Assistance (Categories C-G) and Fire Management Assistance Grants (FMAG). All requests for funding are evaluated individually according to eligibility and other program requirements.

FEMA's approval is for a period of five years, effective the date that FEMA received the adoption documentation. For this plan, documentation was received on March 20, 2025, and is considered approved as of that date. Prior to March 19, 2030, the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians must review, revise, and submit their plan to FEMA for approval to maintain eligibility for grant funding. The enclosed plan review tool provides additional recommendations to incorporate into future updates.
